A lot is spoken about healthy & active cities, & we can encounter various examples throughout the world. It could be a city with pleasant places to play, that functions as one big sports school, where you can grow up safely, & you can cycle with ease. Amsterdam is a city where being active is the enjoyable part of its citizen's daily life. Using the city of Amsterdam as a laboratory, the design workshop offers the students an opportunity to test their design skills by reimagining public spaces in a set of scenarios. The Active city offers inspiring examples of public spaces with special attention on playgrounds. The workshop will take the work of Aldo van Eyck, who designed several post world war playgrounds in the city, as source of inspiration & also interact with various experts engaged in the design and building of public spaces in the city. Students will make a periscope for the 'city at 90 cm height' (eye-level of a child) that proposes design interventions for the selected public spaces which they critically evaluate through the first half of the workshop.

The course is being proposed in collaboration with Academy of Architecture, Amsterdam.

Learning objectives: 1) Identify and evaluate the various aspects of public spaces that contribute to making Amsterdam an active city with focus on urban design work of Aldo Van Eyck 2) Collaborate with various architects, academics and officials of the city to get insights into the design, management and updation of public spaces through lectures, critiques and excursions 3) Through creating various scenarios for selected areas, design different public spaces in the city in collaboration with Academy of Architecture at Amsterdam
